OANA General Meeting Minutes 01-17-2023

The January 2023 General Meeting was held at the Maumus Center, 721 Friscoville Ave., and was called to order at approximately 6:10 pm. Just over 45 people were in attendance. The agenda was presented on a slideshow.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, President Alison Barrios welcomed the first guest speaker, Councilman Gillis McCloskey, who discussed a proposal for the block of land bordered by N. Peters, Aycock, Pontalba & Hernandez, newly back on the market. He pointed out that this is the only undeveloped single city block along the river, and provides a unique opportunity for the Parish and our neighborhood. He then introduced Bryce French, representing the property owners, who suggest that if the Parish would purchase the property, the 3.47 acres could be developed into an entertainment park. French showed a video of a project being built near Birmingham, Alabama, in partnership with Festival Productions (JazzFest and others nationwide), with food & drink outlets, various amenities, and a large multi-purpose amphitheater. Gillis pointed out that of course a vision would have to come from what this neighborhood wants, and a business plan would need to be adopted. Parish President Guy McInnis and the Parish Council will investigate the feasibility of purchasing and using the land. A member from the audience pointed out that a traffic study would be needed for any new development.

The next item on the agenda was an overview of the upcoming May OANA Elections, when all board positions are open for election or re-election. President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and 3-5 Board of Directors slots will be filled for two year terms. All Active Members (2023 dues paid) may nominate, run for office, and vote. Nominations must be submitted in writing by April 30th, and dues must be current to vote. Duties of officers and board were outlined (see slideshow). Anyone interested in serving on the board is invited to the February 2nd Board Meeting.

OANA always invites participation on committees, and would especially welcome help on two new ones, namely Festival Planning (for Sippin' in the Sunset and Sugar Fest) and Event Planning (Member Socials). A quick 4-question survey was passed out and collected at the end of the meeting for input on 1) major issues facing Old Arabi; 2) suggested speakers; 3) interest in joining a committee; 4) interest in a member directory.
